Writer **Kamilah Aisha Moon** and three seniors in the Lewis Center for the Arts' Program in Creative Writing at Princeton University will read from their work on Friday, October 9 at Labyrinth Books in Princeton. Featuring student writers Kelly Byrne, Andrea D'Souza, and Terry O'Shea.

Kamilah Aisha Moon is the author of *She Has a Name*, which was a finalist for the Lambda Literary Award and the Audre Lorde Award from the Publishing Triangle in 2014. She is a Pushcart Prize winner and a recipient of fellowships from the Cave Canem Foundation, the Prague Summer Writing Institute, the Fine Arts Work Center, and the Vermont Studio Center. Moon's work has been published widely, and featured nationally in conferences and venues that include the Library of Congress. She holds an MFA in Creative Writing from Sarah Lawrence College.

The Emerging Writers Reading Series at Labyrinth Bookstore showcases senior thesis students of the Program in Creative Writing and features established writers as special guests.
